

Good News Story

Carwood's general manager Anthony James understands the value of a good apprenticeship – having started his now successful career as an apprentice – and he also appreciates the help provided by The Apprenticeship Works service to make sure the right young people walk through his door...

INVESTING IN YOUNG PEOPLE INVESTING IN BUSINESS

"I'm an ex-apprentice and I really do appreciate the value in taking on young people," says Anthony James, "for me The Apprenticeship Works is a one-stop-shop solution to what can be a complex problem."

Working with The Apprenticeship Works has proved so successful that three of the original apprentices taken on by the business now have full-time jobs and three new apprentices hope the same will happen for them.

The company, which has celebrated its 50th year, was set up by Gary Carter in Coventry and began remanufacturing and distributing specialised vehicle components.

Since then the business has grown steadily and today has more than 210 employees, with a large proportion of highly skilled technical staff.

In an industry where knowledge and experience are highly valued, it is proud that many members of staff, currently 30, have been with the company for more than 20 years.

At its Smethwick business Carwood has worked with The Apprenticeship Works, for more than four years.

The Apprenticeship Works, which is based in High Street, West Bromwich, acts as a broker and is one of only a few government-backed brokerage schemes in the country.

Apprentices are employed by the agency with the employer paying a small weekly contribution and not having any of the worry of paperwork, HR, interview or training costs.

Anthony said: "The Apprenticeship Works handle all the advertising, CV vetting and first interview for me. It means that the right people are sent to us. When we take someone on The Apprenticeship Works is there to provide on-going support, dealing with wages, holidays and any personal issues that can arise, after all we are working with young people who can find the transition from school to employment daunting."

For 24-year-old diesel technician, Paul, the support from both the company and The Apprenticeship Works meant he found the perfect job.

"I came here three years ago through The Apprenticeship Works," says the father-of-one, "the service was really good. It was fast-acting and within a week they found me an apprenticeship here.

"They helped me get my life on track and I am thankful to Carwood for taking me on. At the end of my apprenticeship they took me on. It has meant I can provide for my young family and now I hope to get more qualifications and move up within the business."

For 20-year-old Jake a carpentry course at college wasn't heading in the right direction for him, so he went along the The Apprenticeship Works where he was interviewed and advised about an apprenticeship at Carwood.

After a successful 12 months Jake was taken on full-time as a diesel technician and his confidence has grown since.

Two years ago, despite completing an apprenticeship, 23-year-old Ashley didn't get a job and so he decided to visit The Apprenticeship Works.

Within a week of visiting The Apprenticeship Works, Ashley was sent for an interview at Carwood to join the administration team where he proved himself and after twelve months landed a full-time job as a contract administrator.

PSPO helping to make West Bromwich town centre safer

A new legal order is helping the council and police make West Bromwich town centre safer, with reports of disorder cut by more than half.

An update to Sandwell Council's cabinet says 26 £100 fines were issued during the first three months after enforcement of the public spaces protection order (PSPO) started in October.

Most fines were issued to people breaching the order by causing alarm and distress, including 11 who were involved in letting off fireworks. Five fines were issued for begging offences.

During the October to December period, reports of disorder incidents fell by more than 50 per cent compared to the same three months in 2017. Antisocial behaviour reports fell by nearly 44 per cent.

Council environmental protection officers issued 26 fines and carried out 723 hours of foot patrols around the town centre, often taking part in joint walkabouts with partner organisations.

The council is working closely with West Bromwich Business Improvement District (BID), police, public transport operators and other partners including schools and Sandwell College to make the town safer for everyone.

The PSPO is just one way the council, police and partners are improving safety.

Other measures have included:

- better street lighting and CCTV;
- a radio link used by the police and BID staff to help them respond faster;
- making sure designs for new developments reduce opportunities for anti-social behaviour;
- putting rough sleepers in touch with services that can help them.

The council's control room and CCTV cameras have provided evidence to the police, environmental protection officers and others to help reduce problems.

The PSPO for the town centre complements existing PSPOs in place across the whole of Sandwell that restrict nuisance related to dogs and alcohol.

Councillor Elaine Costigan, the council's cabinet member for public health and protection, said: "This big reduction in disorder is really good news for the town centre. Hopefully people are getting the message that anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated.

"PSPOs are an extra tool we are using to prevent problems, alongside a wide range of other action by the council, police, BID and partners. We are also making sure vulnerable people and rough sleepers are offered support."

Together with the police, the council has also warned people, including parents, that they could lose their tenancy if they, or their children, are involved in anti-social behaviour.

This town centre PSPO order bans the following activities within a restricted area:

- Causing harassment, alarm or distress to anyone
- Threatening violence or being verbally abusive to anyone
- Begging or asking members of the public for money
- Blocking the road or footpath with a vehicle or trailer

Authorised council officers, police and police community support officers can enforce PSPOs. Anyone breaching a PSPO faces a fixed penalty notice of up to £1,000 on prosecution.

Police figures for the three-month period October to December 2018 show a 43.8 per cent fall in reported anti-social behaviour compared to the same period in 2017 (68 incidents down from 121). Reported disorder incidents fell 52.7 per cent (26 incidents down from 55).

Healthy food awards for Sandwell businesses

Seven Sandwell food outlets have scooped awards for serving healthy choices – with one picking up the borough's first Gold award.

Seven Sandwell food outlets have scooped awards for serving healthy choices – with one picking up the borough's first Gold award.

Sandwell Council's Eat Out Eat Well awards recognise caterers who make it easier for their customers to make healthy choices when eating out.

The latest awards have seen five companies – including a national bakery chain, fish and chip shop, staff canteens and a hospital restaurant – pick up accolades from the council's Environmental Health, Trading Standards and Public Health teams.

Staff from each business were presented with their awards at a ceremony at West Bromwich Town Hall.

Sandwell Council's cabinet member for public health and protection Councillor Elaine Costigan said: "We're now in the second year of the Eat Out, Eat Well awards. They're open to caterers, takeaways and other food retailers that meet the healthier eating criteria, have a good food hygiene rating and are compliant with food standards.

"The award aims to encourage food businesses to provide healthier options to customers, through the use of healthier catering practices, increasing fruit, vegetables and starchy carbohydrates and decreasing fat – especially saturated fat – sugar and salt.

"We also use the scheme to recognise food outlets providing healthier options for children, and it also rewards staff training and the promotion of healthier options.

"Providing healthy options is also good for business. Research shows that people are looking for healthier options when they eat out. By providing these options, businesses can provide a better selection of food and boost their takings, while helping their customers look after their health.

"I'd like to congratulate all of the successful businesses who picked up awards last week – they're doing their bit to make it easier for their customers to make healthy choices."



The awards went to:

Sodexo

– a facilities management company which runs two DPD Group staff canteens in Smethwick and Oldbury (two Silver awards).

Greggs

– at The Hawthorns, West Bromwich, and Union Street, Wednesbury, where a healthier range has been introduced, including porridge, soup, wraps and sugar-free drinks (two Silver awards).

BMVJ\

– a joint venture between BAM Nuttall, Morgan Sindall and VolkerFitzpatrick where staff working on the M5 viaduct tuck in to healthy meals (Gold award – the first in Sandwell).

Hallam Restaurant

- used by staff, visitors and the general public at Sandwell General Hospital in West Bromwich (Silver award).

Seavers Fish and Chips, Rowley Regis

– an independent fish and chip shop that offers grilled fish, meals with rice instead of chips and food fried in high oleic sunflower oil which is healthier than standard oils (Bronze award – and the first takeaway to receive an award in Sandwell).

Future High Streets Fund

Sandwell Council is looking to secure funding through the Future High Streets Fund to help it acquire and demolish sites, get land ready for development and improve public areas in West Bromwich town centre.

An initial funding bid is being submitted to the government in March 2019. It will be considered by the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government which will then invite selective local authorities to submit a full business case in the summer. The scheme will be inviting funding bids of between $\pounds 5$ -10 million up to a maximum of $\pounds 25$ million.

The aims of the fund are to invest in high quality town centre living, diversify the experience of the town and improve accessibility.

Kings Market

The West Bromwich indoor market has served the community well for over 40 years and still has many loyal customers.

However, like many retail businesses it has suffered in recent years with declining footfall. Therefore, the council has carried out an extensive review of the market and explored potential development opportunities that could create an attractive and thriving facility that would meet the requirements and expectations of modern market retailers and customers.

As the indoor market is a main anchor for the Kings Square shopping centre, the council has also looked at how a remodelled market could incorporate additional facilities so as to act as a catalyst for a wider regeneration of the Kings Square area of the town centre.

The council is bidding for development funding for this new vision of the market through the Future High Streets Fund.

Funding boost to help tackle youth crime

Sandwell Council is one of only 21 councils to receive money from central government from the Supporting Families Against Youth Crime fund.

The successful bid by Sandwell Council will see more than £370,000 being used in projects in partnership with Sandwell Children's Trust, West Midlands Police and the voluntary sector.

The money will be used to deliver a targeted one to one mentoring programme for at-risk students and parents which will include support in the community. They will also work with parents through the programme 'Triple P', an evidence-based support system for the parents of vulnerable children.


Councillor Simon Hackett, Sandwell Council's cabinet member for children's services, welcomed the funding boost.

He said: "I'm pleased we have been successful in getting funds to support work to help families in Sandwell.

"I am also pleased we are being recognised on a national level for the good work we have already done.

This extra money will help us and our partners continue to help vulnerable young people and make Sandwell a safer place."

The money given to Sandwell is part of a £9.5million fund set out by the government's Communities Department to help families who are vulnerable to the devastating effects of knife crime and gang culture.














Fixing the phones...

IMPROVEMENTS FOR CARTERS GREEN

Following the public consultation just before Christmas, the council has been addressing specific issues raised by residents and businesses to adjust and improve the scheme design.

The council is currently working on detailed designs and costings for the public spaces and roads. Work is still scheduled to start in June and completed before Christmas. Great efforts are being made to programme the works to minimise any disruption.

IMPROVEMENTS TO OTHER LOCATIONS

Spencers Market, High Street

The former M&S building in West Bromwich High Street, formerly known as Spencer's Market, and Burtons building have now been demolished by owners Steamrock Capital.

It is understood the owners are now looking at various options for the redevelopment of the sites to help regenerate this part of the town.

Bull Street Car Park

The council is seeking to identify funding to demolish the multi-storey car park, which has been identified as a potential redevelopment site. Once the funding has been secured, the council will commission the demolition.


In the meantime, the council is considering the redevelopment potential for this site, which will complement the newly-completed housing scheme at Urban 180 in Bull Street and other potential development coming forward on nearby sites such as the Spencer's Market building site.

Shaftesbury House

This former council-owned building has now been demolished. The council is now considering the potential development options for this one-acre site which has a frontage to the High Street near Carters Green. The council is in talks with Black Country Housing Group regarding this cleared site.
