Current local policing priorities

or this BID Newsletter, I thought we could do something slightly different and give you an insight to policing from one of our new student officers, PC Matthew Cooper joined the West Bromwich Town Centre Policing Team earlier this year and here's what he has to say:

I am PC Matthew Cooper a student officer on the Police NOW programme - this programme strives to place a greater focus on neighbourhood policing and tackle long term problems within

communities. Below explains why I joined the police, explains a little more about being a part of Police NOW and my time on West Bromwich Town team - as I come to the end of my first year.

While it sounds cliché, fundamentally I joined the police to help people. I feel privileged to be in the position that I am and love engaging with my local community on an array of issues to try and make them feel happier and safer in their day to day. Despite joining the Police straight after university, I didn't join without my doubts. Seeing how the police had let the public down on so many levels in recent years, I had apprehensions to join an organisation that was letting so many down. Police Now was what changed my mind about this and continues to make me positive about the future of policing.

Having gone through their graduate leadership programme, Police Now is an organisation that is frank and honest about the state of policing and has a clear vision on how they intended to try and change any negative cultures that currently exist within policing as well as promote new approaches to policing by employing the right individuals and giving them the skills to engage with the public and fundamentally start meeting their expectations.

Since joining the police, my main focus as an officer has been on providing an excellent service to my local neighbourhood, engaging regularly with key members of the public, to better understand the problems they face and trying to unite them and tackle said issues. Since joining I have taken extra care to build relations with key organisations on West Bromwich Town Centre such as the security teams on New, Queens and Kings square, the management for the market place, shop owners, members of bus station staff, local charities such as Cranstoun drug intervention and the Let's Chat Hub and of course the BID.

With the support of my supervision and the specialist training provided by Police Now in relation to tackling long term policing problems through evidence-based strategies, I have placed a great deal of focus on finding new solution to tackle long term issues caused by Anti-Social Behaviour. Since being on the team I have engaged with several groups within the local community to try to find unique solutions to street drinking which causes massive detriment to local business, often acts as a catalyst for crime on the town and has significant impact on the overall feeling of safety in West Bromwich.

Over the last months I have assessed the problem and why it exists and started to put in place a strategy which looks to engage the problem in new ways after assessing that previous attempts to tackle this issue haven't been effective. Within this strategy I intend to engage problem individuals and offers them better social support in return for them agreeing to certain criteria. In doing this I aim to take a unique approach to the issue that promotes the support of vulnerable members of the community whist also aiming to put conditions in place so that they can be more effectively managed if they choose to continue to cause ASB despite the support.

In essence the scheme aims to largely promote a supportive approach to the issue rather than one that aims to prosecute individuals with addictions and suffering from deprivation. Despite only making some small changes in the form of engaging the problem groups with Cranstoun in plain clothes and then continuing to build a rapport and offer an education to the groups about the issue's street drinking causes the local community I am positive about the impact this change in approach is already having. Whilst this scheme has received a major setback in the form of the Lets Chat Hub being set for closure at the end of the month, I am working hard to find a suitable solution to this, and still remain positive about the work that has already been done as well as the future of my project.

I am stationed for a minimum of another year in West Bromwich and I'm so proud to be a part of this community. I can't wait to continue to support the local area during my second year of policing and will always welcome any support or advice that you have as I finish my student phase of my policing career.







The final finishing touches to Phase 1 are complete - with the GreenRoots banners up and the Nature art trail completed! Phase 2 is also complete, Bull Street Green Avenue is open, along with the Pocket Park space which Sandwell College Foundation Learning Team are going to be using for Students to learn, relax and create a community led green space. Works has now completed at the site and the facility has opened in September 2023 with new technologies to deliver a range of academic, vocational and apprenticeship courses. Digital Den

The Digital Den project is supporting digital services for West Bromwich communities, creating pathways with training provider EPIC to ensure opportunities are always accessible for education, training and employment through:

- · accredited online training courses
- · careers guidance, and
- online educational resources for children.

Since launching in August 2022, over 250 learners have attended the Digital Den and accessed learning through IT. The investment has also enabled a previous learner being able to gain a Community Support role at the Digital Den Offices. To date 8 leaners have moved onto Health Care jobs.

The Digital Den offers a range of services such as formal training to learners (Provided by EPIC), in supporting community members who lack digital skills and/ or do not have access to online services and offer non-accredited learning. In addition to this, residents drop in for support with their day to day needs whether it be support with telephone calls, help with appointments, referring onto a course or supporting with self-confidence.

Courses are delivered Monday - Thursday 9am-2pm for ESOL, Mathematics, Health and Wellbeing courses at the centre, however, there is an open door policy where the centre supports/refers anyone that comes to the centre

Town Hall Quarter

The West Bromwich Town Hall Quarter Project has received funding from Governments Towns Fund Programme to restore and renovate the Grade II listed West Bromwich Town Hall and Central Library buildings, internally and externally as well as providing a new Equalities Act compliant entrance from West Bromwich High Street.

Over the last 12 months, works form the earlier Accelerated funding element of the Project has enabled refurbishment works to take place on the Town Hall Bell Tower which has now been completed. Scaffolding to both buildings has enabled the contractors to undertake the preliminary works, surveys and additional investigations over the summer to detail the complete package of restoration works required. External cleaning works have commenced to prepare the buildings for the restoration works. The Central Library remains open as normal.

Restoration works are planned to start at the end of October 2023 and once completed, will help transform the Town Hall and Central Library (built in 1907) into a modern and vibrant facility to benefit local people, community groups and third sector organisations in West Bromwich.





