## Fire Safety Within Buildings

### Legislation

The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (FSO) is the main piece of legislation governing fire safety in buildings in England and Wales. The Order places the responsibility on individuals within an organisation to carry out risk assessments to identify, manage and reduce the risk of fire.

The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (FSO) is Enforced by your local Fire Authority.

### **Fire Risk Assessment Guidance**

Fire Risk Assessments are a legal requirement for businesses and non-domestic premises. Your local Fire service can't complete a fire risk assessment for you, but they can provide advice and guidance.

### Who's responsible?

You are responsible for fire safety in business or other non-domestic premises if you are:

- an employer
- the owner
- · the landlord
- · an occupier
- anyone else with control of the premises,
   e.g. a facilities manager, building manager,
   managing agent or risk assessor

You're known as the 'Responsible Person'. If there's more than one responsible person, you must work together to meet your responsibilities.

The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (FSO) also applies if you have paying guests, e.g. if you run a bed and breakfast or guesthouse, or let a self-catering property.

### A Fire Risk Assessment will;

- · identify the fire hazards
- identify people at risk
- evaluate, remove or reduce the risks
- record your findings, prepare an emergency plan and provide training
- review and update the fire risk assessment regularly.

### Keeping your Fire Risk Assessment updated.

In addition to doing an initial fire risk assessment, it's important that if there are any changes to your premises that may impact your business, property or staff, a further assessment is done to take into account changes in risk.

### You'll need to consider:

- · Emergency routes and exits
- Fire detection and warning systems
- Firefighting equipment
- The removal or safe storage of dangerous substances
- An emergency fire evacuation plan
- The needs of vulnerable people, eg the elderly, young children or those with disabilities
- Providing information to employees and other people on the premises
- taff fire safety training.
- · Equipment, drills and training
- Fire detection and warning systems

You must have a fire detection and warning system. You may need different types of detectors, depending on the type of building and the work carried out in it.

### **Fire-fighting Equipment**

The types of equipment you need depend on your business premises. You'll need to have any equipment properly installed, tested and maintained and train your staff to use it if necessary.

### **Maintenance and Testing**

You must carry out regular checks to make sure that:

- · All fire alarm systems are working
- · The emergency lighting is working
- You record any faults in systems and equipment
- All escape routes are clear and the floor is in good condition
- All fire escapes can be opened easily
- Automatic fire doors close correctly
- Fire exit signs are in the right place

You need to train new staff when they start work and tell all employees about any new fire risks.

You should carry out at least one fire drill per year and record the results. You must keep the results as part of your fire safety and evacuation plan.












Busiest day of the month is 17th March 2023 with 25,509 people in West Bromwich Town Centre.

### Current local policing priorities

COVID-19 | Under-25 Violence | Domestic Abuse



s we move into March there will be a focus on business crime as the NBCC (National Business Crime Centre) launches a national month of action to tackle retail crime – not just in West Bromwich but also across the whole of Sandwell.

The month of March will see police work with retailers, the local BID and other partners in a defined area for a day of targeted activity, which will include joint high visibility patrols, proactive activity against known offenders and crime prevention campaigns.

West Bromwich Town Centre Neighbourhood team have arranged two separate days where we will be present at dedicated locations to offer support and advice:

As always, I would like to promote West Midlands Police's online reporting tool – this is only to be used when it is not an emergency and no one is detained - Incident report | West Midlands Police (west-midlands.police.uk) à www.west-midlands. police.uk/incident-report. This is a simple 8 minute method to report crime, this can be completed on a desktop, mobile or tablet. This creates an online report number which is then allocated to the local team for further investigation.

Along with the online reporting tool I would also like to promote Axon Citizen – this is a platform which West Midlands Police uses. It allows us to send out individual invites to witnesses directly from Axon Capture or Axon Evidence. The system then allows you to upload footage, images or sound clips directly and securely to West Midlands Police within seconds. à this is currently being used by a number of businesses across West Bromwich and has helped reduce the need for officers to repeatedly visit locations to collect CCTV, it can be uploaded at your convenience.

## Sandwell confirms new **Public Spaces Protection Orders**

Following a public consultation, Sandwell Council has agreed to the introduction of Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) relating to alcohol, dogs and BBQs/fires in public spaces across the Borough

For the last three years two boroughwide PSPOs related to alcohol consumption and dogs have been in place in Sandwell. PSPOs last for three years before they need to be considered for renewal so we asked residents for their views about whether or not to renew these orders.

The previous orders required people not to consume alcohol in an area where nuisance or disorder is occurring and to surrender any alcohol in their possession if asked by an authorised officer.

In addition, anyone in charge of a dog had to pick up their dog's faeces should it defecate whilst in their control. This year the council also confirmed that dog walkers will be required to carry an appropriate receptacle for dealing with their dog's waste and making it an offence to allow a dog into a children's play area / enclosed sports areas such as tennis courts which have been designed to exclude dogs.

A new prohibition relating to BBQs / fires on public land including campfires because of the fire risk was also considered. Cabinet decided that this order should be adopted

A PSPO gives the council the power to issue a Fixed Penalty Notice in relation to anyone refusing to comply with any of these requests.

Sandwell Council's Cabinet Member for Public Health and Communities, Councillor Syeda Khatun, said:

"We have adopted these new PSPOs after consulting widely with many residents and businesses across all six towns. They told us that we all want to live in a pleasant place where people treat each other with courtesy and respect which is why they told us that this approach is appropriate which is why we will be delivering it."

Responses to the consultation revealed that:

- Alcohol 97% in favour of continuing with this prohibition
- Dogs 98 % in favour of continuing with existing prohibition
- 92% supported requiring dog owners to carry receptacles (poo bags) to clean up after their animals
- 91% supported excluding dogs from enclosed play / sports areas
- BBQs / Fires 87% supported prohibiting BBQs / fires in public places

## Towns Fund Update

The Urban Greening project has delivered a number of initiatives to enhance the existing greenspace and improve the appearance of the town centre. The new and improved areas within the centre have been enjoyed by residents, businesses and visitors for several months now.

s part of the project, Multistory have been busy delivery a number of workshops as part of the Urban Greening Cultural Programme. Some activities include planting of a wildflower Garden, community friendly seasonal walks led by The Wildlife Trust and photography workshops by local photography artists.

There are a number of upcoming activities, including a course on Wildlife Habitat and Maintenance, taking place from 13 to 17 May 2024, three guided seasonal walks in Spring 2024 and a celebratory event in Summer 2024 which will involve performances, workshops and activities in and around the meadow.

The Central St Michaels Sandwell Science, Engineering and Manufacturing Centre welcomed it's first set of students in September 2023. Formally known as the Sandwell MEC,

the campus is located on West Bromwich High Street and will support higher and advanced level skills and qualifications for students at both Central Saint Michael's Sixth Form and Sandwell College.

The new centre is initially welcoming young people aged 16-18, but there will be opportunities for Adults (aged 19+) and Apprenticeships. For potential students, applications are welcomed

The Digital Den project located at Wood Lane Community Centre continues to deliver training and learning courses to residents and community groups. Since launching in August 2022, 529 learners have enrolled to access training courses. 18 learners have completed ESOL, 14 learners passed Functional skills and have progressed to the new cohort in functional skills and 14 learners have completed accredited training, from which 1 is working as a Health & Social Care worker at Sandwell Hospital and 1 is working part-time as a book-keeper. From Level 2, 1 learner went onto Accountancy, 4 are working at City Hospital and 3 are working in Health and Beauty.

Restoration works continue on the West Bromwich Town Hall and Library as part of the Town Hall Quarter project. Works commenced in November 2023 and will complete at the end of November 2024.

The West Bromwich Connected project has delivered a new pedestrian footpath along West Bromwich Inner Ringway, connecting existing footpaths on West Bromwich Inner Ringway and Bull Street/ High Street.

Consultation for the next set of works from the Town Centre to Beeches Road and Roebuck Lane via High Street will launch Spring 2024.


